# A Private View of Osborne House and the Isle of Wight

(joining at Portsmouth)

**from the Royal Hotel, Ventnor \*\*\*\***

A private guided tour of **Osborne House** is the highlight of this three-night short break which is based at the island's leading AA four star hotel, renowned for its service and comfort and within a short walk of the famous **Ventnor Botanic Gardens**.

The Isle of Wight has been a favourite destination with several prominent historical figures including Queen Victoria who referred to Osborne House *A Place of One's Own*.

Osborne House remains much as it was when Queen Victoria died in 1901 and the richly furnished apartments offer an intimate glimpse into the private family life of Britain's longest reigning monarch.

Also, near Ventnor is the shell of **Appuldurcombe**, once the grandest house on the island and now in the care of English Heritage.



As we explore the Isle of Wight we can discover 800 years of history at **Carisbrooke Castle** which was once the home of Princess Beatrice, Queen Victoria's youngest daughter, and royal connections at **St Mildred's Church** at Whippingham, designed by Prince Albert.

**Brading Roman Villa** has a relatively new Exhibition and Visitor Centre and the beautiful monastic church and Medieval Abbey ruins of **Quarr Abbey** are home to a community of Benedictine Monks.

We also travel to **Yarmouth Castle** and **Farringford House**, the former home of Tennyson and now a hotel.

## Detailed Itinerary

**Day 1** This fully guided break will begin on **Monday** morning with an early morning start from **Bressenden Place, London**, travelling on a fully air-conditioned executive coach. On arrival at the **Wightlink** ferry terminal at **Portsmouth** we will board the ferry for the 40 minute crossing to Fishbourne.

From Fishbourne we continue to **Carisbrooke Castle**, the only remaining medieval castle on the Isle of Wight. Here we can discover 800 years of history and an almost complete castle with battlements and a keep to climb. Carisbrooke Castle has enjoyed royal links and was once the home of Princess Beatrice, youngest daughter of Queen Victoria. A new feature, the Princess **Beatrice Garden** has recently been recreated by Chris Beardshaw, garden designer and former BBC Gardeners World presenter. With pretty period planting, a fountain and plunge pool, clipped hedges and an orchard of fruit trees, this **Edwardian-style garden** promises to delight. There are the famous donkeys on the 16th century tread-wheel to see and the **Carisbrooke Castle Museum**.

We then drive to our hotel situated on the southern side of the island. There should be plenty of time to relax after checking in and before dinner is served.

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**Day 2** On **Tuesday** morning we will enjoy a full English breakfast before we visit nearby **Ventnor Botanic Garden** and explore the local area. Ventnor Botanic Garden lies in the remarkable microclimate at the heart of the famous *Undercliff*. This unique garden is protected from the cold northerly winds by chalk downs. Indeed, it holds the warmth from its southerly aspect so well that, combined with the moderating influence of the sea, frost is rarely seen.

The true potential of the site was recognised by the late Sir Harold Hillier, the internationally famous plantsman of Winchester and it was Sir Harold Hillier who introduced some of the tender and exotic plants that can be seen growing today although much replanting has been undertaken in the last couple of decades following severe winters and storm damage.

Next, a scenic coach journey via **West Wight, Freshwater Bay** and **Tennyson Down** to the **Farringford Hotel**, where we have a two course buffet lunch with coffee. **Alfred, Lord Tennyson**, then Poet Laureate, was a familiar sight walking these cliffs in Victorian times and the area is named Tennyson Down in his memory. The Farringford Hotel was his former home and we should be able to view his study during our lunch stop. We then continue to **Yarmouth** to explore the quaint pubs, shops, cafés and Yarmouth's Tudor Castle. Overlooking the narrow channel of the Solent between Yarmouth Arrow Head Castle in Britain and the last castle built by **Henry VIII**.

We return to the hotel at the end of the afternoon and enjoy dinner in the restaurant later in the evening.

**Day 3** Our first visit on **Wednesday** morning is to **Appuldurcombe House**, once the grandest house on the island and now just a shell. An exhibition depicts the house and its history. Later, after a coffee stop (not included) we drive to village of Whippingham to visit the church. **Whippingham Church**, also known as **St Mildred's** was not only a place of worship for the Royal family but also designed by Albert Prince Consort and rebuilt by **Queen Victoria** in conjunction with him in 1861.

Our journey continues to **Osborne House** where lunch can be taken (not included) on arrival. Afterwards, join your tour leader and explore the restored walled garden before free time to enjoy the extensive grounds and **Swiss Cottage**, the Royal children's playhouse. Our tour of the house commences when the house closes to the public. Osborne House evolved from modest beginnings, under the watchful eyes of Queen Victoria and Prince Consort and now comprises of several wings, apartments and buildings. The opulent interiors will afford you the opportunity to view some exceptional architectural design and admire lavish decoration reminiscent of the house in Queen Victoria's day. The day ends with a leisurely dinner in the hotel restaurant.

**Day 4** On **Thursday** we travel to **Brading Roman Villa and Visitor Centre**. This provides a unique insight into Roman life in Britain, from beautifully preserved mosaic floors to an extensive collection of Roman archaeology, including coins, pottery and tools. Coffee, refreshments and light lunches can be purchased before we drive to Ryde and **Quarr Abbey**.

Quarr Abbey is named after the once extensively worked local quarries. A few ruins of the original abbey founded in 1132 still remain, but beyond these lie a magnificent example of modern architecture. The current abbey was erected in 1904 to provide accommodation for Benedictine monks expelled from France in 1901. The abbey is still occupied by Benedictine monks to this day.

From Quarr Abbey we drive to Fishbourne for our return ferry journey to Portsmouth. Depart at leisure from Portsmouth or return to London in the coach with the approximate arrival time in London being 19.15hrs.

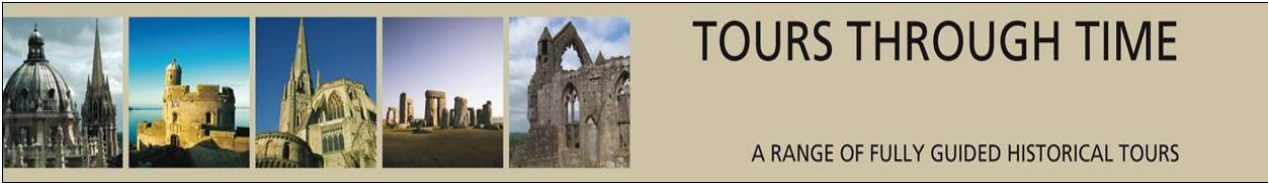
### How to Book

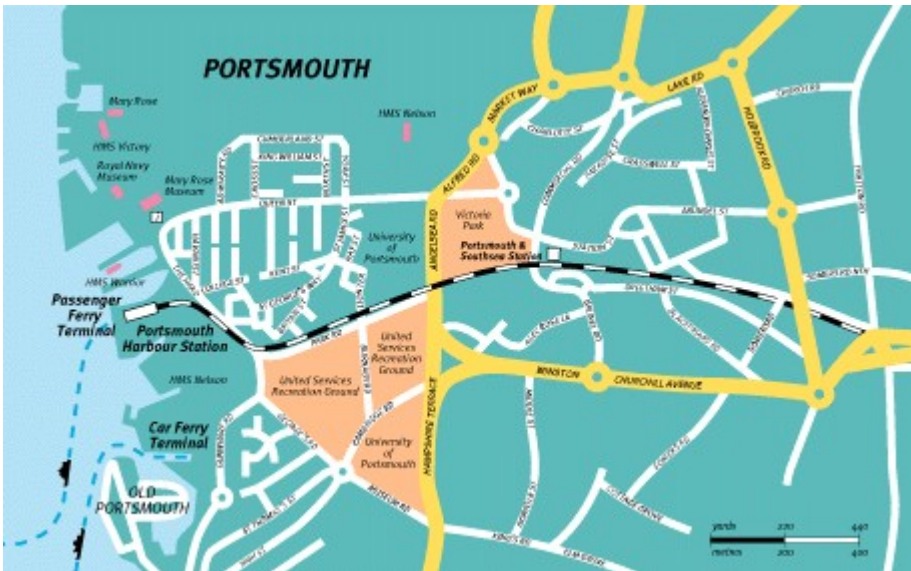

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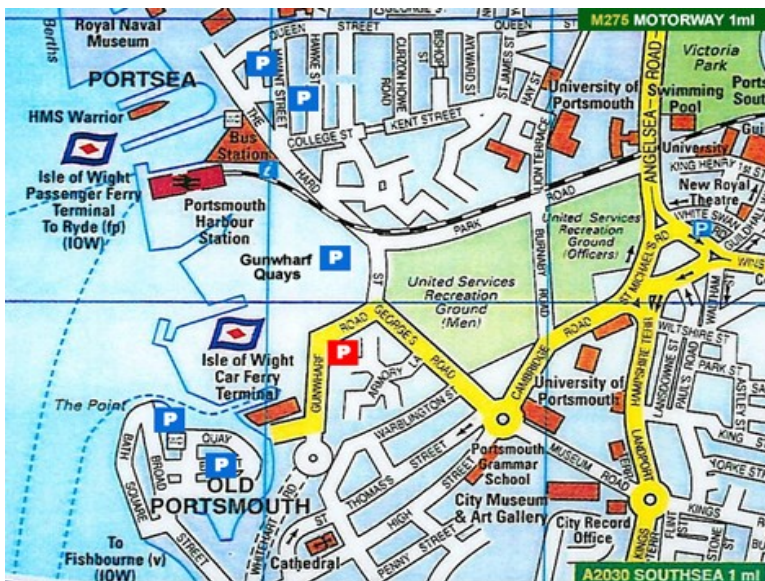


## Joining instructions for Portsmouth

There are 2 terminals at Portsmouth; please go to the Gunwharf terminal. The terminal is a 10 minute walk from Portsmouth Harbour Railway Station and The Hard Interchange Bus Station and there is car parking close-by. Terminal facilities include a cafe, shop and toilets. The coach will collect guests from the Gunwharf terminal at approximately 11.30hrs.



**Car Parking** There is a car park opposite the car ferry terminal in Gunwharf Road. Parking charges are £7.00 for the first 24-hours and £6.00 for each additional 24 hours.
